[SB 32](#) This legislation places certain substances on the controlled substances schedule and to declare an emergency. *Signed by the Governor, 2/8/2018*

[SB 62](#) This legislation provides for the notification related to a breach of certain data and to provide a penalty therefor. *Monitoring – Scheduled for Hearing, House Judiciary 2/21/2018*

[SB 63](#) This Legislation revises certain prohibitions regarding methamphetamines and to create a mandatory penalty for a violation thereof. *Monitoring – Do Pass Amended, Senate 2/15/2018*

[SB 65](#) This legislation revises certain provisions regarding drug deliveries that result in death and to provide a penalty therefor. *Monitoring – First Read in House and Referred to House Judiciary 2/14/2018*

[SB 75](#) This legislation establishes certain provisions regarding the dispensing of biological products. SDPhA Position: Neutral. *Board of Pharmacy testified as a proponent. Signed by the Speaker 2/5/2018, Signed by the Governor 2/8/2018*

[SB 122](#) This legislation provides for the payment of claims for covered services provided by a health care provider via telemedicine or telehealth. *Monitoring – Tabled, Senate Health and Human Services 2/7/2018*

[SB 123](#) This legislation addresses utilization of telemedicine or telehealth by a health care professional. *Monitoring – Tabled, Senate Health and Human Services 2/7/2018*

[SB 141](#) This legislation establishes certain provisions regarding pharmacy benefits management. SDPhA Position: Support. *SDPhA testified as a proponent. House of Representatives Do Pass, Passed 2/12/2018*

[SB 172](#) This legislation provides for an opt out by certain professions from the Interstate Compact for the Temporary Licensure of Professions established by HB 1319. SDPhA Position: Support. *SDPhA Board of Directors voted to ask for pharmacists' inclusion in SB 172 at the Jan. 22, 2018 board meeting. The Senate State Affairs committee unanimously approved the amendment adding pharmacists to the legislation. Senate Deferred to Another Day 2/12/2018.*

[SB 176](#) This legislation establishes certain provisions around prescribing opioids. *Monitoring – Deferred to the 41st Legislative day, Senate Health and Human Services 2/7/2018*

[HB 1309](#) This legislation has been heavily amended and now would provide for a periodic review of the sales and use tax exemptions. SDPhA testified against the original legislation which revised certain sales tax exemptions, and the tax rate on the sale of food. That version would have eliminated the sales tax exemption several goods, including prescription drugs. *Monitoring – Taxation Do Pass Amended, Taxation Title Amended, Passed, House Taxation 2/15/2018*

[HB 1319](#) This legislation adopts the Interstate Compact for the Temporary Licensure of Professionals. SDPhA Position: Oppose. *SDPhA Testified in opposition. Do Pass, Passed, House State Affairs 2/14/2018*
